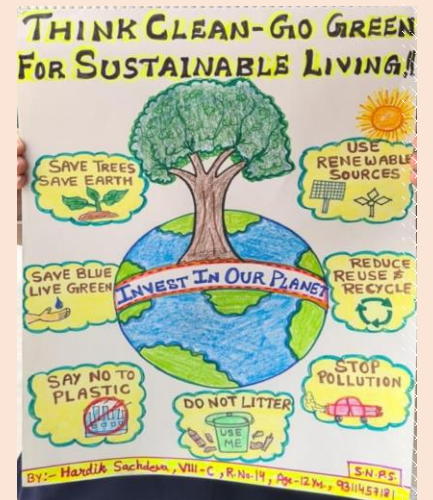

'A river is more than a resource, it is a treasure So, save your life and future by saving the Yamuna.....'

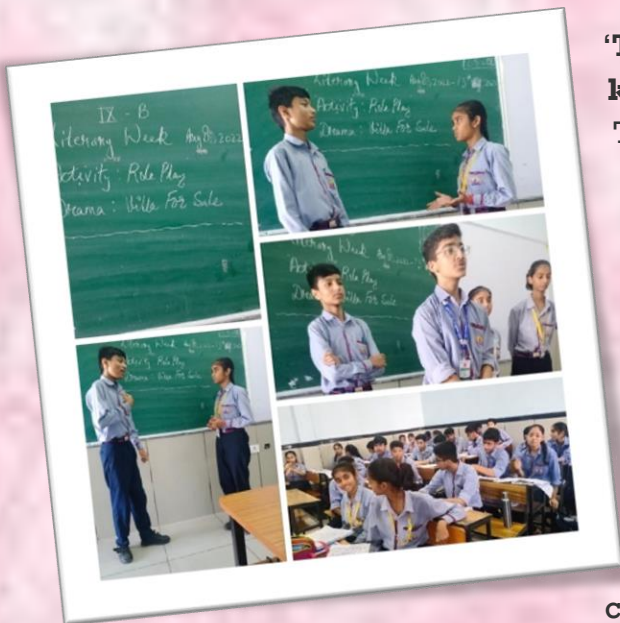

‘The conquest of learning is achieved through the knowledge of languages.’

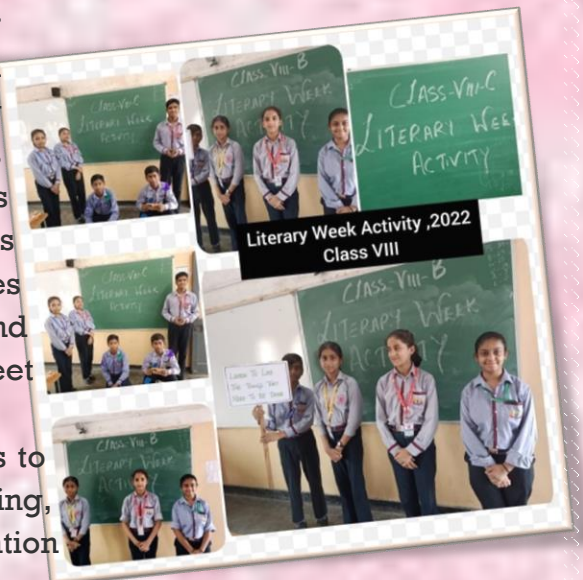

creative in their

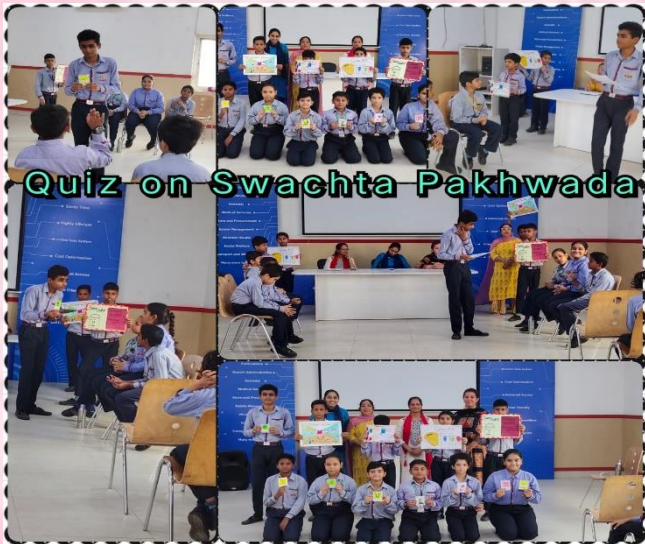

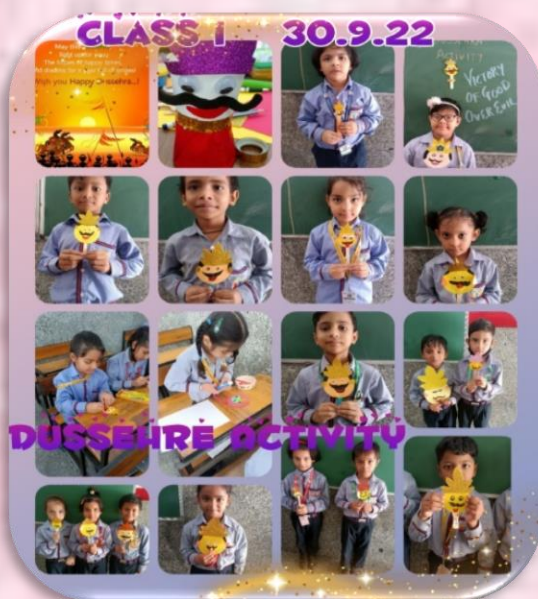


SHIKSHAK PARV

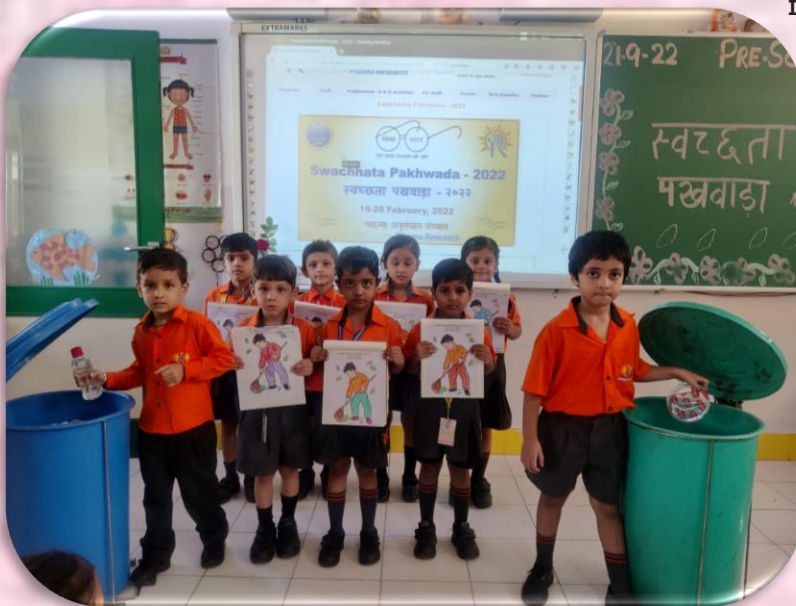
MATKI DECORATION COMPETITION

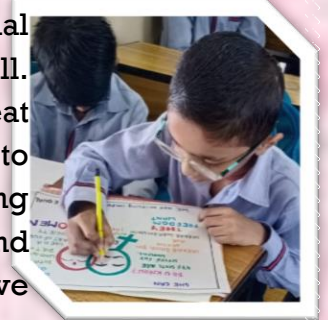

Activity: PLANT AND ANIMAL CELL PREPARATION WITH WASTE

‘Don’t throw it away, it can be used in some other way.’



Considering the 5 R's: Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose, Recycle, a unique science activity was conducted on 16th July, 2022, for the students of Class IX. The students prepared plants and animal cells with the waste material available at home. The art equated well with science during this art integrated activity. Students scouted an innovative fun learning technique for better understanding of concepts.

“Science Activity : REFLECTION AND REFRACTION OF LIGHT AND ADULTERATION OF FOOD.”

‘Learning about the reflection and refraction of light energy is like learning the secret to a magician’s tricks.’

A Science activity was conducted for the students of Class X, to cover the topics of reflection, refraction and adulteration of food, under the surveillance of science teachers. Students were able to distinguish between reflection, where light travels in a straight line bouncing off objects, and refraction, where light bends as a result of a change in medium. Also in true solution like sugar or salt solution molecules are not enough in size due to which path is not visible, but colloidal and suspension solutions particles are large enough due to which path is visible.

Food adulteration refers to the act of intentionally debasing the quality of food by either adding or replacing the food substances with undeclared alternative components, or by the removal of some valuable components. This is usually done to lower the cost or increase the bulk of a given food product.

To conclude, students were able to identify examples of reflection and refraction in daily life and understand the adulteration of common foods like milk, sugar, turmeric etc. and their adverse impact on health.

PATRIOTIC SONG ACTIVITY



Patriotic Song Activity was conducted on 26th July, 2022 in all the sections of Class IX. Each student prepared a Hindi patriotic song. 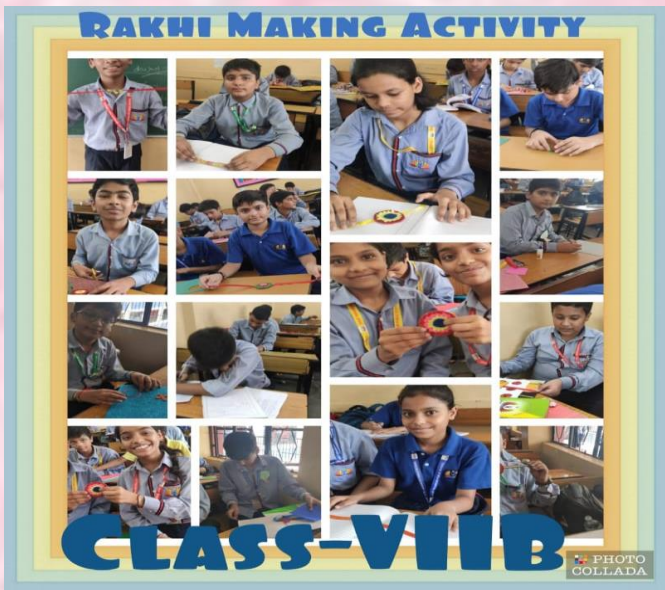

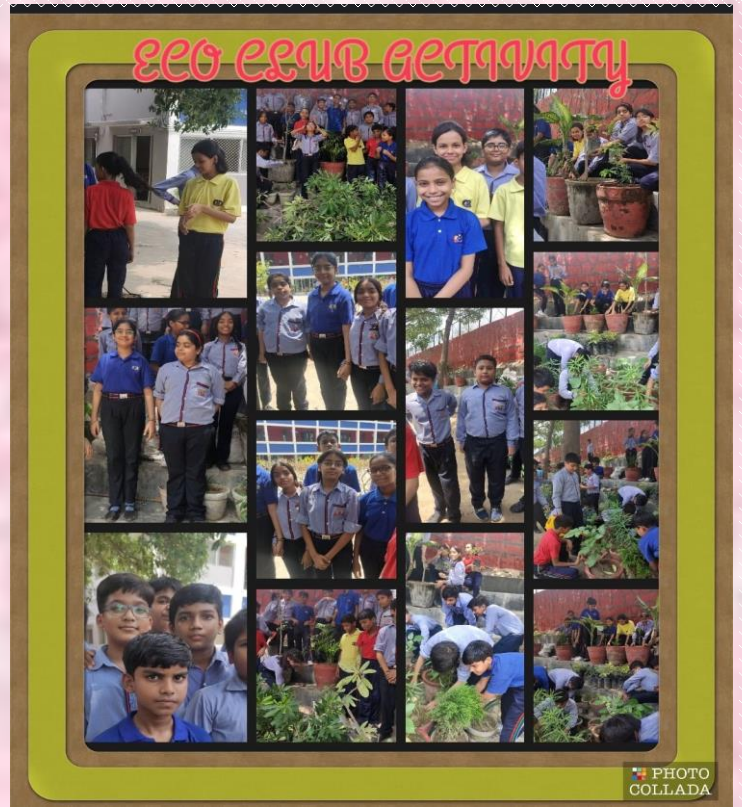
