‘Dance is the poetry of the body, the rhythm of the soul, and the language that speaks when words fail.’

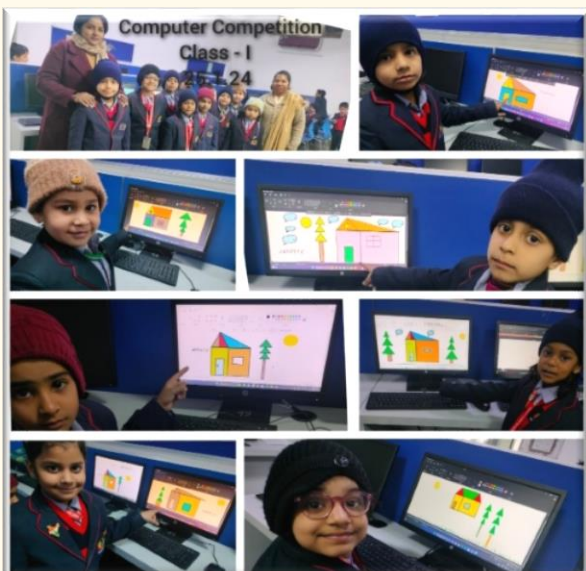

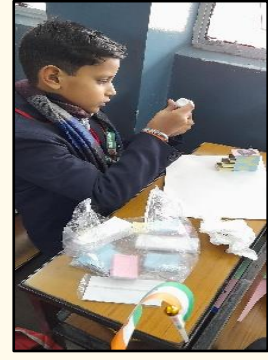

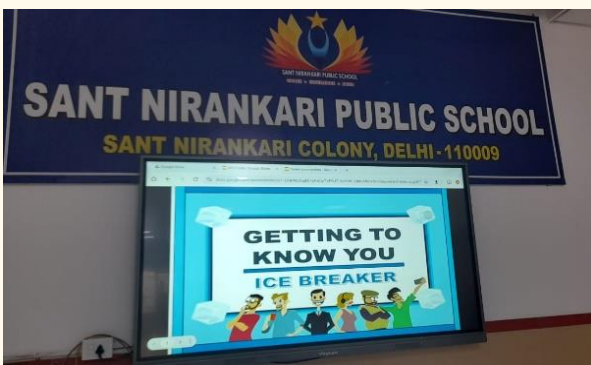


CAREER COUNSELLING SESSION (05.02.24)

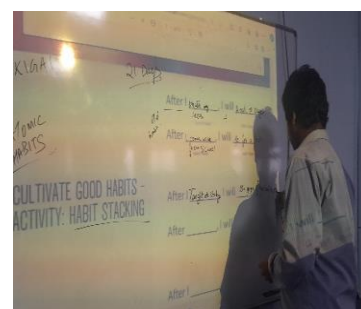
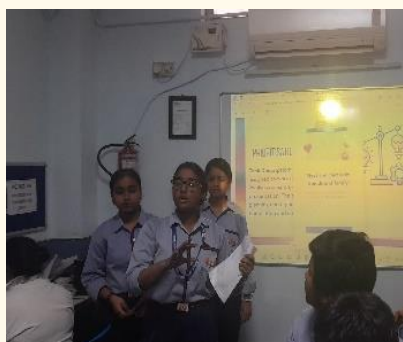

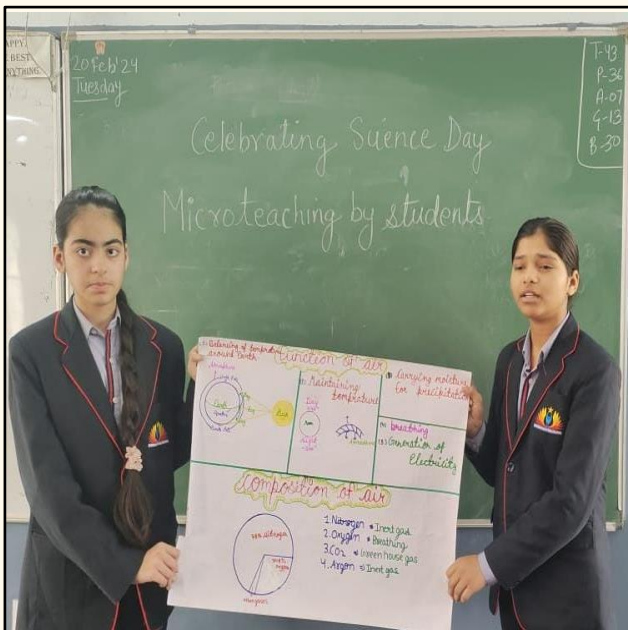
